

The Government Bursary Scheme is to help the most vulnerable 16-19 year olds in full-time education. The 16-19 Bursary Fund has two elements:

- Young people in care, care leavers, young people in receipt of income support and disabled young people in receipt of Employment Support Allowance, who are also in receipt of Disability Living Allowance, will be eligible to receive a Bursary Award of £1,200 a year.
- Schools and College may then use their discretion to make awards to young people in ways that best fit the needs and circumstances of their students. Bursary Awards should be targeted towards young people facing financial barriers to participation such as the costs of transport, meals, books and equipment.

Tollbar MAT Sixth Form College Young People's Bursary 2018/19:

Students may be entitled to a Bursary Award if they meet any of the following criteria:

- Students in care, care leavers, young people in receipt of income support and disabled young people in receipt of Employment Support Allowance, who are also in receipt of Disability Living Allowance, will be eligible to receive a bursary of £1200 a year.
- Students aged 16-18 on the 31 August 2018, who are commencing their studies in 2018/2019 and whose current gross household income is less than £18,000.
- Students who live more than 25 miles from the College.

In exceptional circumstances, if an individual fails to meet any of the above criteria but feels they might qualify due to an individual situation, the College can be approached and a Bursary Award granted at the discretion of the College.

Students entitled to receive a Bursary Award must also meet the following requirements:

- Have 100% attendance for the given week. If a student is absent for any reason it must be authorised by a parent/carer meeting the College's attendance criteria. If students are on holiday for any part of a week, or have unauthorised absence during any part of a week, they will not be awarded payments for the given week.
- Meet the full requirements of the expectations set out in the student Social Contract.
- Meet all deadlines for work set by individual Curriculum Areas.

To apply for the Tollbar MAT Sixth Form Young People's Bursary then please complete the reverse of this application form and enclose all required evidence.
