Other Suggestions	 Develop your awareness of the key literary time periods and the works that are representative of these Explore different literary lenses or criticisms such as Historicist, feminist, Marxist etc. and consider how they apply to the set texts Research the waves of feminism and how these have impacted society Use revision sites such as SparkNotes to study plot, character and themes Revise literary and poetic devices used by writers to make meaning
