

# A sample of Gibraltar Point

Our A-level Geography students have completed another round of field work having visited the Gibraltar Point National Nature Reserve in April.



Our Year 12 geographers used the visit to practise different physical sampling techniques and methods as they investigated succession and ecology in sand dunes and saltmarshes along our coastline. Classroom analysis will follow and Geographical Information Systems will be used to present the data as part of their non-examined assessment.
